OVERVIEW OF 2017 PROGRAM:

More than 70 students representing 47 lowa high schools attended Business Horizons 2017, held June 25-29 at Central College in Pella. Throughout their five days, students teamed up with a variety of lowa professionals to create new products and launch mock businesses. Students competed in an online business simulation, visited local companies and took part in fun team-building activities. Participants also had the opportunity to hear from dynamic speakers on topics such as communication tactics, financial literacy, workplace culture, opportunities in Iowa and more. On the final day of the program, teams pitched their products to a panel of "investors" and received feedback from marketing experts on their product infomercials, filmed and edited by the students. Friends and family attended the 2017 Business Horizons Trade Show and Graduation where students showed off their hard work, took home top honors and celebrated a week of success.

2017 UPDATE:

YP lowa revamped its organizational membership model heading into 2017, and grew to 10 organizational members. 


